

Free honey tasting

1. Free honey tasting was available all day, every day and was always popular. The line-up was nearly always long with people wishing to taste this year's special Qld honey varieties for the Ekka. These were yapunyah, collected from the far west of Qld in the channel country, tea tree gathered from around the Sunshine coast and macadamia from the Bundaberg area.
